Admissions Policy September 2010

As St. Paul's is a Voluntary Aided College admissions are controlled by the Governors in consultation with the Headteacher. In 2010, 150 places will be available for entry into the Lower Sixth, and applications are welcome from Catholic, other Christian and other faith students both from St Paul's Year 11 and students in other local schools and colleges.

Applications for admission are considered in the following order of priority:

1. Students who have attended St Paul's Catholic College for at least one year.
2. Baptised Catholic students attending other schools.
3. Students of other Christian denominations who attend other schools who can produce a letter of recommendation from a Church Minister.
4. Students from other schools who would like to study in our Sixth Form and who will be comfortable with our ethos.

In September 2010, the Governors plan to make 110 places available to St. Paul's Year 11, and 40 to students attending other schools. A minimum of 80% of places will be offered to students seeking to study 'A' Level Courses (Level 3).

In the event that there are more applications than places available, the direct distance of the student's home from the College site will be the determining factor, with places being allocated to the nearest, then the next nearest, etc.

The closing date for applications to be received is **18 December 2009**, although spare places will be allocated to late applicants after this date.

Prospective students will be interviewed in early spring 2009. Entry to the Sixth Form is subject to:

- o A positive satisfactory reference from your Head of Year 11.
- o Achieving the GCSE grade entry requirements for each course.

Course availability is subject to student numbers and timetabling restrictions. The student and their parents, jointly, have the statutory right to appeal if the student is refused admission.

Transport to St. Paul's

No guaranteed transport is available for students in post-16 education. However, there are a number of options available to students who study at St. Paul's. We encourage students to use public transport wherever possible as an environmentally friendly option.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Train

Burgess Hill train station is approximately 30 minutes walk from the college. There are public buses that run from the station to the college.

Students travelling by rail on the Southern network are eligible to obtain discounts on season tickets valid for one month or more. Tickets for 2007-8 were discounted at 34% with a minimum payment of £8 per week. Contact Southern to see if this is running for this academic year. Students should apply on-line for the discount using a Sussex Student Card identity number on Southern's further education website.

Bus

Public transport buses that go past St.Pauls include route 100 through Compass Travel, and routes 34/35/36 from Country Liner. For more information regarding timetables please see: www.compasstravel.co.uk/timetables and www.countryliner-coaches.co.uk/timetables

From September 2007, full-time students (aged 16-19) will be able to travel by bus in West Sussex at half the adult fare at any time.
